Quick Reference Guide for Families & Senior Citizens

 **REMEMBER: Digital Arrest is NOT REAL!**

No government agency arrests people over phone calls or video calls

Warning Signs of Digital Arrest Scams

-  Someone claims you're "digitally arrested" over phone/video call

-  Demands immediate money transfer or payment

-  Threatens legal action or jail time within hours

-  Claims to be from police, CBI, or other agencies

-  Asks you to stay on call continuously

-  Demands bank details, OTP, or UPI PIN

-  Shows fake documents or ID cards on video call

-  Pressures you to not tell family members

What to Do Immediately



- ✓ **HANG UP** the call immediately
- ✓ **DO NOT** transfer any money
- ✓ **DO NOT** share OTP, PIN, or bank details
- ✓ **INFORM** family members right away
- ✓ **BLOCK** the caller's number
- ✓ **REPORT** to cybercrime helpline: 1930
- ✓ **CONTACT** your bank if you shared details
- ✓ **SAVE** caller's number and call recordings as evidence
